

Thoughts & reflections from members of our circuit staff team

Time is marching on.....

At the start of the new church year, the staff went to the Yorkshire Sculpture Park, for a day of team building, business, planning the mission of the circuit and obviously lunch! During the morning, to inspire our discussions, we were told to go out and wander, look at the sculptures and reflect on our mission here in and around Barnsley.

Debbie and Alison wandered around the art installation entitled 'Relics' by Daniel Arsham. Huge sculptures were eroded and broken, some partially buried in the ground, some with holes in them where giant metallic looking crystals grew.

The artist says of the sculptures 'All objects become antiquated and in some way they all become ruins or relics.'

Time is marching on......

This gave us much food for thought. The giant rabbit to someone of Deacon Alison's age looked like Dylan from the 'Magic Roundabout'.

The Spaceman was more obvious but belonged to a time when man first landed on the moon.



The Pikachu model seemed modern to us, but in actual fact was a relic from the mid 90's, so it's really almost 30 years old!

We pondered how this related to our churches. Did people 'of a certain age' recognise our churches, but the younger generation doesn't see them as we do? Are the things we think are new and modern, not actually as relevant as we think?

Time goes by and things become unrecognisable or no longer relevant very quickly. A young boy walking past recognised the spaceman, but he had no idea what the other sculptures represented. That made us wonder, what do people perceive when they see our churches?

But in the decay and deterioration, shiny new crystals grew. The statues would never be the same. The crystals would not make them what they once were, but something new was growing out of the old.


Can we as a people here in Barnsley, take what we have and grow something completely new for God, letting God use the old and transform it into something similar but different for His glory?

We've just got to be brave enough to let the new burst out of the old.

Part of the discussions from the staff day included the staff breaking off into small groups to cover specific topics. Linda stammers & Daphne Irwin were partnered together to consider how they could use their Lay Worker roles to forge new inter-generational community partnerships with the schools and Care homes based in the North East Church More to Follow in the next newsletter.

Identify the requirements to become an Eco Circuit providing resources and training to enable Churches and the Circuit to fulfil them.



The desire to become **ECO** churches is part of our shared mission and a priority declared by the Connexion, Sheffield District and Barnsley Circuit.

A small group from the NW Church has been leading the **ECO** Church development, as defined by the **A Rocha international ECO Churches organisation.** Criteria to gain three levels of award are set out, some of which follow. We felt a festival could celebrate what is taking place in Barnsley; help us to learn together about how to work with and in our communities and demonstrate our commitment, as Christians, to actively care for creation.

But what steps had we taken on the path to becoming **ECO** Churches?

One criterion suggests that we should contact and talk with our politicians and share our concerns. We had previously sent letters to local politicians asking about their policies and practices in relation to the COP conferences. An ECO theme in teaching, learning and worship - a further criterion - was relatively easy to achieve, with careful planning and preparation. Rev Louise Dawson, encouraged each chapel to hold a similar service and to write responsive, individual ECO pledges. Such promises help us all to publicly commit and see that every individual step makes a difference. Harvest Festivals offered great opportunities to reflect on creation, including learning about the impact of our behaviour on the climate and, consequently, on housing, community and food security.

Similarly, working alongside and contributing to Christian Aid's Climate Crisis campaign, helped churches to understand the global picture and how we can help to mitigate the impact. Being Fair Trade churches actively assists this understanding. We encouraged each chapel to use **ECO** cleaning products by buying large quantities and sharing them.

Work to enhance grounds and gardens of our chapels, is another key criterion. We involved young people in installing bird boxes and a regular group of 'gardeners' engage in maintaining grounds, planting shrubs and trees, to encourage insects or provide hibernation sites. Operating with Twiggs, the grounds maintenance organisation, and Barnsley Parks Department, members of chapels have planted trees in Dodworth and donated bird boxes to Kexborough. Many of these activities involved a further criterion of community engagement.

Some of the **ECO** Church criteria create different demands for chapels. Emmanuel found it difficult to recycle its rubbish, without incurring considerable expense; as the building is used by many groups a commercial service is needed. Individuals are urged to help by taking re-cyclable rubbish home with them. Other chapels have found that much easier to achieve, whilst struggling with other aspects.

Many of our buildings provide the biggest **ECO** challenge of all. The District grants towards building assessments have been matched by the mission fund of the Barnsley Circuit. This has included detailed reports on improvements chapels can make to conserve energy; reduce draughts and save money. Calculating our carbon footprints is an even bigger challenge.

In the spring, Emmanuel achieved a Silver A Rocha award (Birdwell and Hoyland had already gained Bronze award and Kexborough and Buckley are almost ready to submit for recognition).

So why did we decide to hold an ECO Fest? Watch this space!!

In the next newsletter, we will write about the event and how it contributed to many aspects of working towards becoming recognised **ECO** Churches.

Good News for Everyone might not be a name with which you are familiar but you are likely to know our former name – the Gideons. (founded over 100 years ago). A couple of years ago we in the UK, known as Gideons affiliated to the International Organisation founded by the USA, broke away and formed our own identity whilst still carrying on the


same work under the name of **Good News for Everyone**.

After a lengthy consultation on what the new name should be, the deciding factor was that we wanted to convey in our name what it is we essentially do, and bringing the **Good News for Everyone** as Jesus did - seemed to be a bit of a no brainer in the end!

Our philosophy is that the **Good News** of Jesus should be freely available to all and we aim to make it so. We are careful not to preach because that is something different – although we sometimes get invited to speak in churches and then we have a freer rein. But in the main we present the Testament without obligation and trust that by sowing a seed great things may come as a result – and we have many a testimony where this has been the case.

The Barnsley Branch are small in number but we try to carry out all our duties as best we can. **Interested in joining us or finding out more?** See contact details below.

What is it we do? We distribute Scriptures, completely free of charge, to all sorts of places and individuals as required by our constitution. These include schools, hotels, guest houses, B & Bs, hospitals, care homes, uniformed organisations, prisons, individuals on request, sports clubs (professional and amateur), police, armed forces and any other opportunities that might come our way.



A big part of our work is in schools. We aim to get into every High

School in Barnsley, every year, to do a short presentation to the Year 7 intake and distribute the little red testaments which comprise the New Testament, Psalms and Proverbs. These presentations can take as little as ten minutes depending on how much time the school has available – we are really in their hands and are grateful for any time they can give us. In recent years it has been increasingly difficult to gain access to schools, for a variety of reasons. This has not just been a local issue but is reflected widely in the region and nationally. However, when we do get in we are always well received and the pupils generally appreciate what they're given. Some of the teachers have still got their own "red bibles" they first received at school many years ago.

When we place Bibles in hotels etc. it tends to be the complete Bible and you may have come across one in the drawer of your bedside table when you've been on holiday. Now you know how it got there!

How are we funded? and how do we pay for all of these free Bibles? Our Treasurer is in charge of basically two funds – the Local and the General – and these are generated by donations and fund raising. We don't receive any funding from the National Organisation in Lutterworth, but believe me when I say that the Lord always provides enough for His work to take place.
