

The Greenhouse - Youth Worship



It's a Sunday afternoon in June.
The technology is thankfully working well, as one of the leaders invites everyone to use their phones to connect to the interactive Bible quiz.

There's a scrabble for phones, some people joining together in teams.

"You can either scan the QR code or use the web address on the screen..."

We've had a time of worship with a live band, giving thanks to God and inviting everyone to focus their hearts and minds on what He has to say to us.

A greenhouse is a place not only of new beginnings, where plants can germinate and start their journey but also a place to grow and strengthen in safety.

Helen, a former youth worker, who worships at Brierley, was moved to look around at how she could get involved in youth work in the circuit – in particular, she felt passionately about the worship experience for young people. She started by gathering as many Christian youth workers as she could find to come together, pray and talk about what is already available and whether there was a desire to add a new event. Now, working with our North West youth worker, Libby, The Exodus Project, and the youth workers at St George's Church in Barnsley town centre they have put together Sunday afternoon services once per half term that are aimed at teenagers, with modern worship songs, games, quizzes and teaching.

Our vision is for young people in the Barnsley area to use The Greenhouse services to find out more about our Christian faith, come closer to Him through worship, and have a safe place to spend time in prayer with the support of their youth workers.

There's still plenty to look forward to! On Saturday 13th September, we'll gather for a circuit youth sleepover at Emmanuel, before Youth President welcome service on Sunday 14th.

We're especially excited for 3Generate, the national Methodist youth residential in October—always a highlight of the year!

We are hosting a fundraiser at Hoyland and Birdwell Chapel on Saturday 20th September—come grab a treat and help support our young people as they prepare for this year's 3Generate!

As I prepare to begin my year as **Methodist Youth President** 2025-26, I find myself reflecting on the journey that has brought me here – a journey rooted in the Methodist Church, shaped by worship, community, and a growing love for God's people.

It is with great joy and honour to be entrusted with this role. I'm excited to listen to and stand alongside young Methodists across Britain, to represent their voices, and to encourage them in their walk with Christ. The Barnsley Circuit of the Methodist Church has offered me space to grow in faith, leadership, and identity – and now, I look forward to helping other young people around the Connexion find that same space in their home churches.



This year, I hope to be a bridge – connecting generations, communities, and experiences across our Connexion. I want to create space for honest conversations, where young people feel seen, heard, and valued. I led expeditions in the mountains of Africa's Rift valley, Norwegian Arctic, Slovak/Polish Tatra and the Alps.

For some time now churches in South London have been filled with the majority African and Caribbean population. Our black brothers & sisters gently taught my minority white english faith to put ALL my trust in the Lord ONLY and in no one else. This is how I met & married Christina and the photo shows our hearts open to each other, giving hospitality to the holy family that stays with us every Advent and Christmas.





Christina & I are blessed with 4 children & 6 grandchildren between us. The necessity of make and mend enabled our own survival as well as the planet. I think I inherit my parent's example of making and mending things. Dad has performed darning maintenance on his jumper for 50 years and he only puts his bin out for collection once a year. This picture was drawn in celebration of things we made and mended for my first experience of fatherhood. Little did I know I would be sending this same picture 36 years later, to celebrate God's gift of our 5th grandchild Seren, meaning star in Welsh.
